Mens captain update from Richard

Since my last update we have played 4 ESL and 3 ESL triples matches. In the ESL we played Caterham away 8-2, Epsom home 10-0, Ashstead away 0-10, and Cheam Fields away 1-9, making a total of 28 points for and 23 points against. After beating Epsom 10-0 we were top of the league but after losing to Ashstead 0-10 and Cheam Fields 1-9 we dropped to 4th position. At Bletchingley on 22nd we won 8-2 and moved up to 2nd position just 6 points behind Ashstead, so all to play for in the remaining matches as Cheam Fields are seven points behind with 2 games in hand.

In the ESL Triples league we won 6-4 against Cheam Fields at home and 6-4 against Old Coulsdon at home. We lost 0-10 to CMO's in dreadful conditions. We gave up after the minimum 12 ends. Total points accumulated in the ESL triples to date 12 points for and 18 points against.

We've been struggling for names in the ESL matches, which we believe is due to members playing their internal competitions, which seem to be taking precedence over the ESL matches. Please ensure that club matches take priority over personal internal competitions. *So please check the fixture book before arranging club competitions.*

The Australian pairs on 29th June and 19th July were both cancelled due to lack of numbers and the Ladies county two wood day on 2nd July was successful.

We hosted our annual fixture London Parks v Surrey County on 6th July and the Combined Areas v Surrey County on 11th July which also coincided with the

SCBA Triples ¼ final in the evening. Our own Surrey triple, Matt, Wayne and Norman unfortunately lost but did extremely well in the competition. So well done to them. We also had our annual match with the Surrey Masonic Bowling Association on 13th July and the BCBA Centenary Triples that same evening.

On Sunday 23rd July we had a friendly match against the BCBA and once again struggled to field six mixed

rinks, so we played 4 triples and the BCBA lent us a triple to make 5 triples in all. We had a win with John Wake's triple so well done to John and his team.

The Australian Pairs on the 3rd August has now been replaced with a mixed triples tournament.

The ESLL game against Godstone was cancelled and is being rescheduled as Godstone had a Covid case while they were on tour last week.

The Rules of Possession

After you have delivered a bowl, you have two choices. If you desire to track your bowl, you must be at the head when it stops. If you choose to stay at the mat, you must be there when the bowl stops. By observing this rule, you ensure that the next player gets to play immediately when your turn is over. Avoid frustrating other players by following the rules. The rules also state that the rink shall belong to the team whose bowl is being played. While playing, players in possession of the rink shall not be disturbed or interfered with.

The system is now being used for all matches from 1st August until the end of the season and all matches for August are now available to apply for. Croydon Changes

Most people would say that the 1960's were the most damaging period for the buildings of Croydon. I would say that the Victorians started it when Military at Addiscombe was closed in 1862, the Mansion House was demolished (dating from 1703) and Canning, Clyde, Elgin, Havelock and Outram Road were built. The college gymnasium is now Havelock Hall, a block of flats.

In 1896 the High Street in Croydon was widened from 23 feet to 50 feet. This meant the destruction of several small streets between the High Street and Surrey Street "the Middle RowSlum Area". However, looking at the photos, in "Relics of Old Croydon" by John Pelton it shows buildings' that were dilapidated and possibly even medieval. Two 17 century houses in Bell Hill are listed.

Also, in 1896 Croydon's third Town Hall was built on the site of the short-lived Central Croydon railway station a short spur from East Croydon Station

Many Victorian buildings were also demolished in the 1960's especially the Whitgift Middle School in North End site of the present Whitgift Centre, the Victorian villas in the Park Hill Area where the Wates Park Hill Estate was built on the expiry of the 99 year leases on houses built on land owned by the Church Commissioners.
